## WORLD'S LARGEST BIPLANE TO APPEAR AT FALCON FIELD IN MESA, AZ JULY 16, 2001

On **July 16**, the Vimy Aircraft Project's replica Vickers Vimy biplane will be making an appearance at the **Confederate Air Force Museum** at **Falcon Field in Mesa, AZ**.

**After making fly-bys at several Phoenix area airports**, the Vimy will arrive early in the afternoon of July 16. It will be on display for the remainder of the day and will depart early on July 17 for El Paso, TX.

While on display, Vimy pilot and Maricopa County resident Mark Rebholz will answer questions about his upcoming re-enactment of the first nonstop Transatlantic flight. Other Vimy Aircraft Project pilots and volunteers will be selling t-shirts and hats and accepting donations to help support the Project.



The Vimy, which is the world's largest airworthy biplane, is on its way from Novato, CA, to the EAA's Airventure air show in Oshkosh, WI, where it will be one of the main attractions.
